

TESTIMONY IN FAVOR of RAISED BILL No. 133

AN ACT ALLOWING POLICE OFFICERS TO WEAR RELIGIOUS HEAD COVERINGS AS PART OF A POLICE UNIFORM.

To Whom It May Concern

My name is Mohinder Singh Kalsi from Norwalk CT and I am licensed engineer in the State of Connecticut. First of all, I would like to thank you for this opportunity for written testimony in favor of Raised Bill No.133 (An Act allowing police officers to wear religious head coverings as part of a police uniform) in front of the Connecticut Public Safety and Security Committee.

Just for your information, Sikhism is the 5th largest organized, independent, and ethnic religion in the world with more than fifty million followers worldwide recognized all around the globe. Sikh Turban known as "Dastar" is an integral part of the Sikh faith that signifies a commitment to uphold dignity, freedom, social justice, and equality for all.

The lack of understanding and ignorance, the Sikhs have been victims of 9/11 hate crimes So this bill will not just help us break those barriers in society created by ignorance but will help our police departments to hire people from various faith backgrounds that represent our state's diverse population that will promote diversity and inclusiveness. Thus, I respectfully request you to consider this bill and welcome other future bills as well which will help us create Connecticut that reflects our diversity.
